

First look at Oran Park Tavern, second pub by Momento Hospitality

A region transformed from rolling hills to suburbia could soon be home to not one, but two pubs with plans to bring a second venue to Oran Park, with an in-house brewery and smokehouse.



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The developers bringing a ‘super pub’ to one of the country’s fastest growing suburbs in Sydney’s southwest have plans to build a second tavern in the area in a matter of years.

Oran Park has been Sydney’s fastest growing suburb across the past decade, transforming from rolling paddocks to the desired home of thousands of families.

Momento Hospitality has promised the suburb a three-storey “super-pub” touted to be one of the best in all of Sydney.

Now, the same operators are promising yet another pub for the booming suburb – the Oran Park Tavern with exclusive artist impressions by Archebiosis Architects shared with the *Macarthur Chronicle*.

Momento Hospitality chief executive Marcello Colosimo said he loves Oran Park, and can’t wait to bring the community two new venues to boost night-life.

The newest proposal is the Oran Park Tavern which will have a “homely warm neighbourhood feel”, Mr Colosimo told the *Macarthur Chronicle*.

The Tavern is set to have an in-house brewery with a smoked-meat restaurant named Fire and Brimstone – selling brisket and whole pigs.

“This pub will have some special features that will be unique to the area Including a boutique Brewery producing a wide range of alcoholic and non-alcoholic beers, a smokehouse called Fire and Brimstone, drive through bottle shop and all the normal features you would expect in a neighbourhood pub,” Mr Colosimo said.

This means Oran Park residents will have beer, ginger beer, seltzer and spirits brewed right in their own suburb.

Meanwhile, the Oran Park Hotel is touted to be a high-end pub featuring a rooftop cocktail lounge, a picturesque beer garden, first class restaurant and bistro, as well as a woodfire pizzeria and cafe on the ground floor.



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There are also two cinemas planned, each with a 40-person capacity, for the first floor of the entertainment complex alongside a number of function rooms.

When asked why he plans to bring two pubs to the same Macarthur suburb, Mr Colosimo said it was because he loved the area and “couldn’t wait to start serving locals”.

“The Perich family with Greenfield developments have been amazing to work with and we want to build hotels that make the community proud,” he said.

“We have had such great feedback since showcasing our designs and we should commence earthworks as soon as we get council clearance which should be in the next month or so on the first hotel in the town centre.”

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When will construction begin?

"We are super keen to get going," Momento Hospitality CEO Marcello Colosimo said.

"As soon as we get the construction approval, we will start within weeks. From our point of view, we are expecting that (construction approval) in the next couple of months."

What have you been working on lately?

"We are working through more detailed designs for each area," Mr Colosimo said.

"The place is pretty big. We are working on how the cinemas are going to work, how the kitchen will look.

"We just can't wait to bring it to life."

When will the pub open?

"We are going to open in stages," he said.

"We hope to open our doors for the first stage one year after construction begins, with the entire pub to be complete six months later."

"The ground floor will open first, with the pizzeria, then from there the cinemas and rooftop cocktail lounge.

Has the pandemic changed anything?

"Hopefully not by the time we open," Mr Colosimo said.

"It would be a concern opening a pub of this size in today's environment, but hopefully by then we are all vaccinated and able to enjoy."
